UFC is a farmer owned cooperative that will be celebrating their 100th Anniversary in 2015. UFC's sales are in excess of \$310 Million with operations in Grain, Agronomy, Feed, Energy, C-stores, Farm Equipment, Powersports, Construction and Consumer Goods and Hardware. UFC is a significant business partner and employer with over 350 employees in 16 communities in South Central Minnesota.

In 2012, the doors opened on UFC's shuttle loading facility near Brownton, Minnesota. This state of the art facility has storage capacity of over 7 Million bushels and is designed to load 110 car shuttle train in under eight hours. This facility's current capabilities allow for the offload of 300+ trucks per day.

HighLine Grain is a grain marketing and transportation business comprised of five partnering country elevator companies who operate in 55 locations in addition to a shuttle train loader due for completion in 2015.

His career in agriculture includes eight years with Great Western Malting as Director of Grain and Transportation, NA in addition to over 20 years in management and development of country grain elevator companies.

Bailey represented the malting industry to the Washington Barley Commission, is a past Commissioner of the Washington Grain Commission, serves as a board director and past chairman of the Wheat Marketing Center in Portland, Oregon, served as a director for the PNW Grain & Feed Association, and currently serves on the Country Elevator Committee of the National Grain & Feed Association.
